Start with our next generation, the younger the better. That is the mission of Young Enterprise; making a growing impact across Northern Ireland as it forges a connected world of young people, business volunteers and educators dedicated to succeeding through enterprise.

The dynamic, trusted charity is actively developing an ethos of innovation and entrepreneurship in young people through our work in Primary, Post Primary, Special Schools, FE Colleges, University, and the local community.

Young Enterprise offers enterprise, entrepreneurship & financial education for all young people, regardless of age, gender, background or location.

We believe in the unlimited potential of young people, and want to give them the best start in life and support them in achieving their full potential.

Enterprise education is vital for social mobility, to even the playing field and ensure all young people develop self-efficacy and skills they need to succeed. That's why we work with 72% of Post Primary schools with greatest social need, with 52% of sessions taking place in areas of greatest social need. We have specially adapted programmes for Special Educational Needs and ensure our programmes map to the NI Curriculum to support the delivery of Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities.

OUR REACH

Due to school closures, our normal programme of delivery was suspended in mid-March 2020. The reach figures relate to the September 2019 to March 2020 period. We worked directly with educators, parents and young people during Term 3 to provide online activity engagement which is not included in these figures.





Young Enterprise offers financial and enterprise education experiences throughout Primary, Post Primary and Tertiary education. Investing in young people from an early age can develop self-belief and increase aspirations, empowering them with the skills and confidence they need to succeed in life.

Through enterprise activities, learners build confidence & gain entrepreneurial skills including critical thinking, problem-solving, communication, risk-taking & teamwork.

Research shows enterprise education students are 3 to 6 times more likely to start a business in future.

Entrepreneurship offers alternative pathways for young people, improving their skills, employability and life chances, supporting wider economic and social development.
